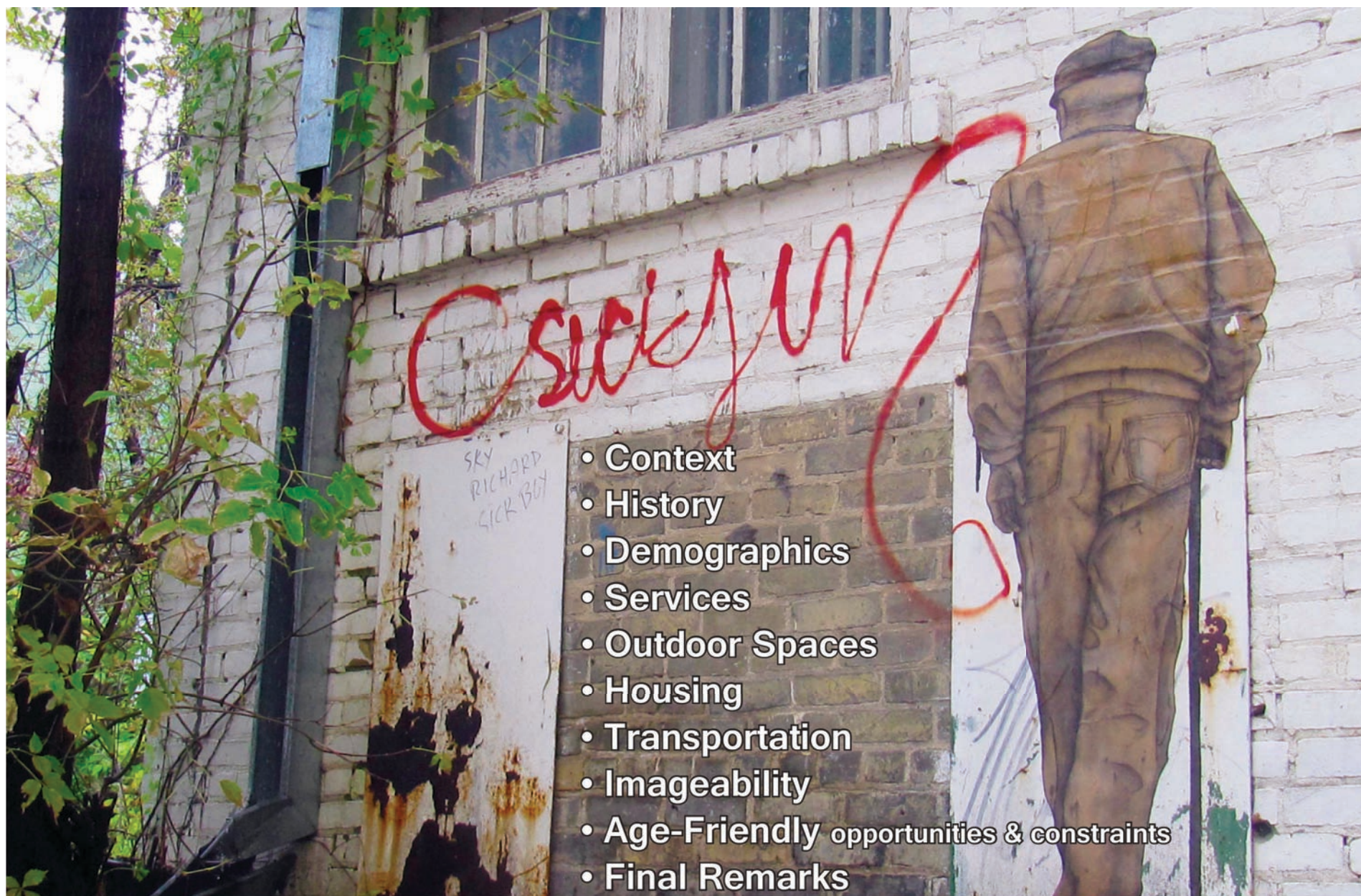

HISTORY

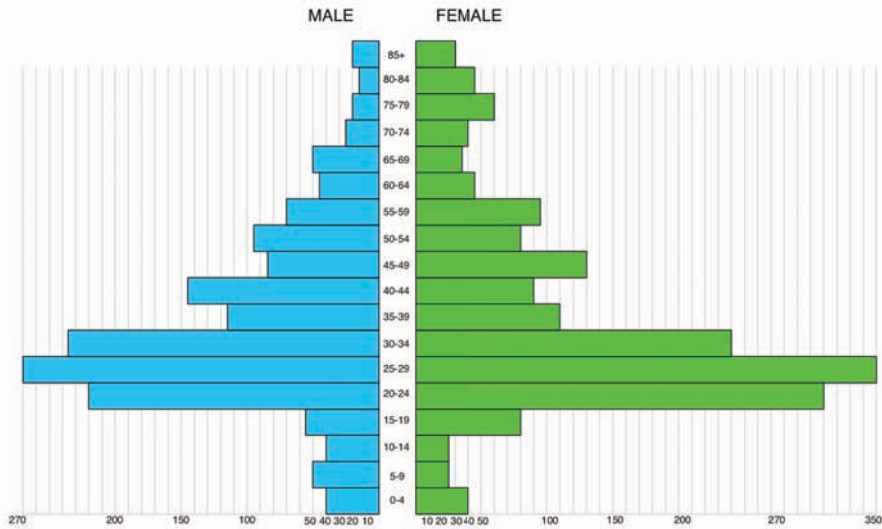

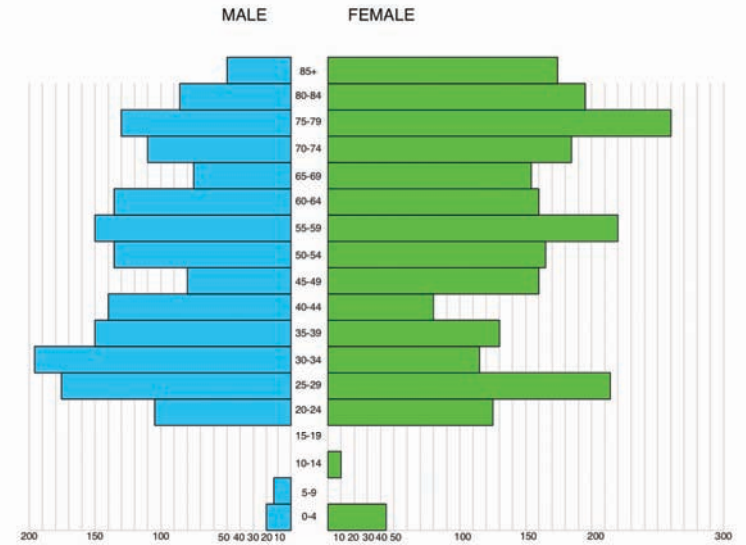
Osborne Village in 2006 census River-Osborne (4,870), Roslyn (4,145), and McMillan (3,425) making the total 12,440 residents

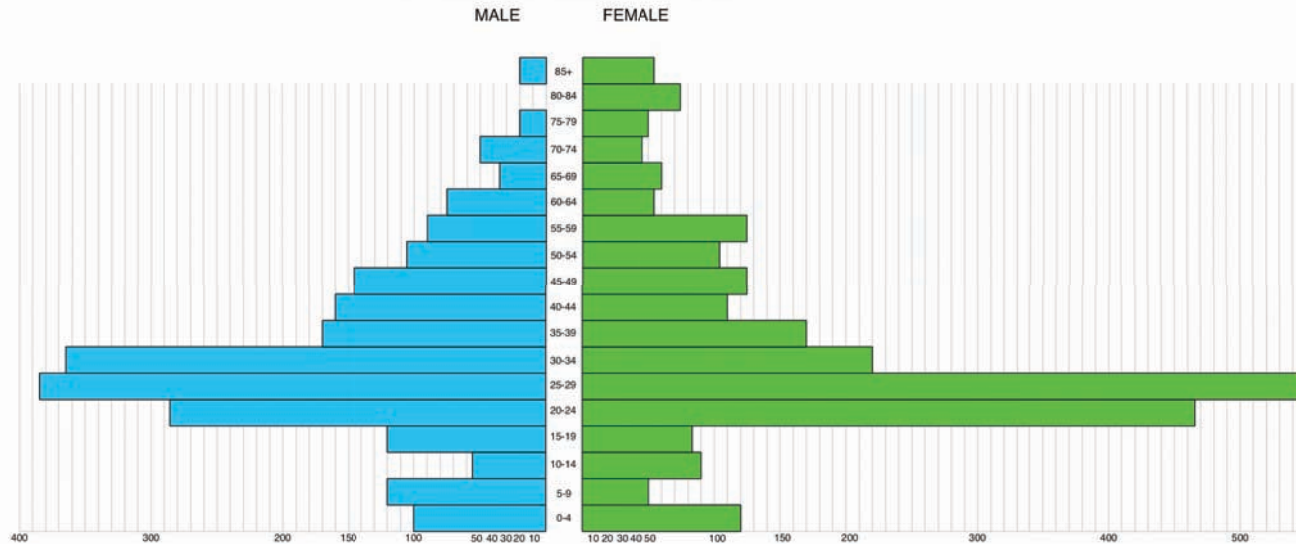
POPULATION BY AGE- McMILLAN



POPULATION BY AGE- ROSLYN

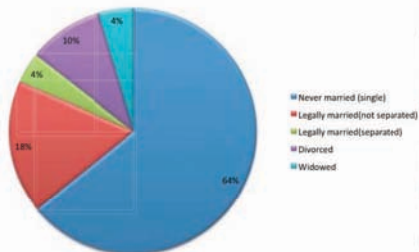


POPULATION BY AGE- RIVER -OSBORNE

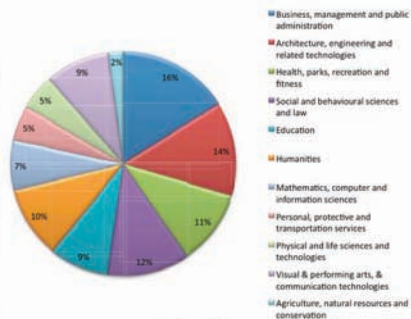

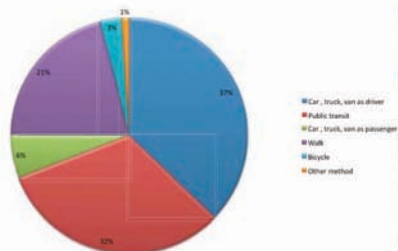
Marital Status - River-Osborne



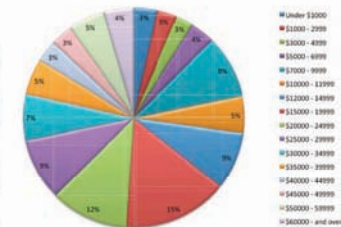
Population with Post-Secondary Education (25-64 years) River-Osborne



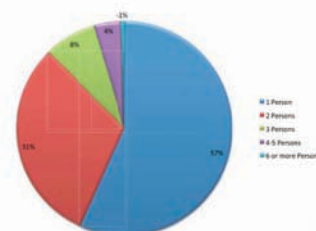
Mode of Transportation - River-Osborne



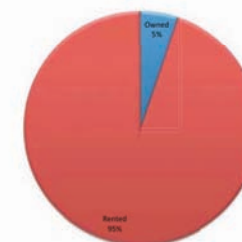
Income in 2005 - River-Osborne

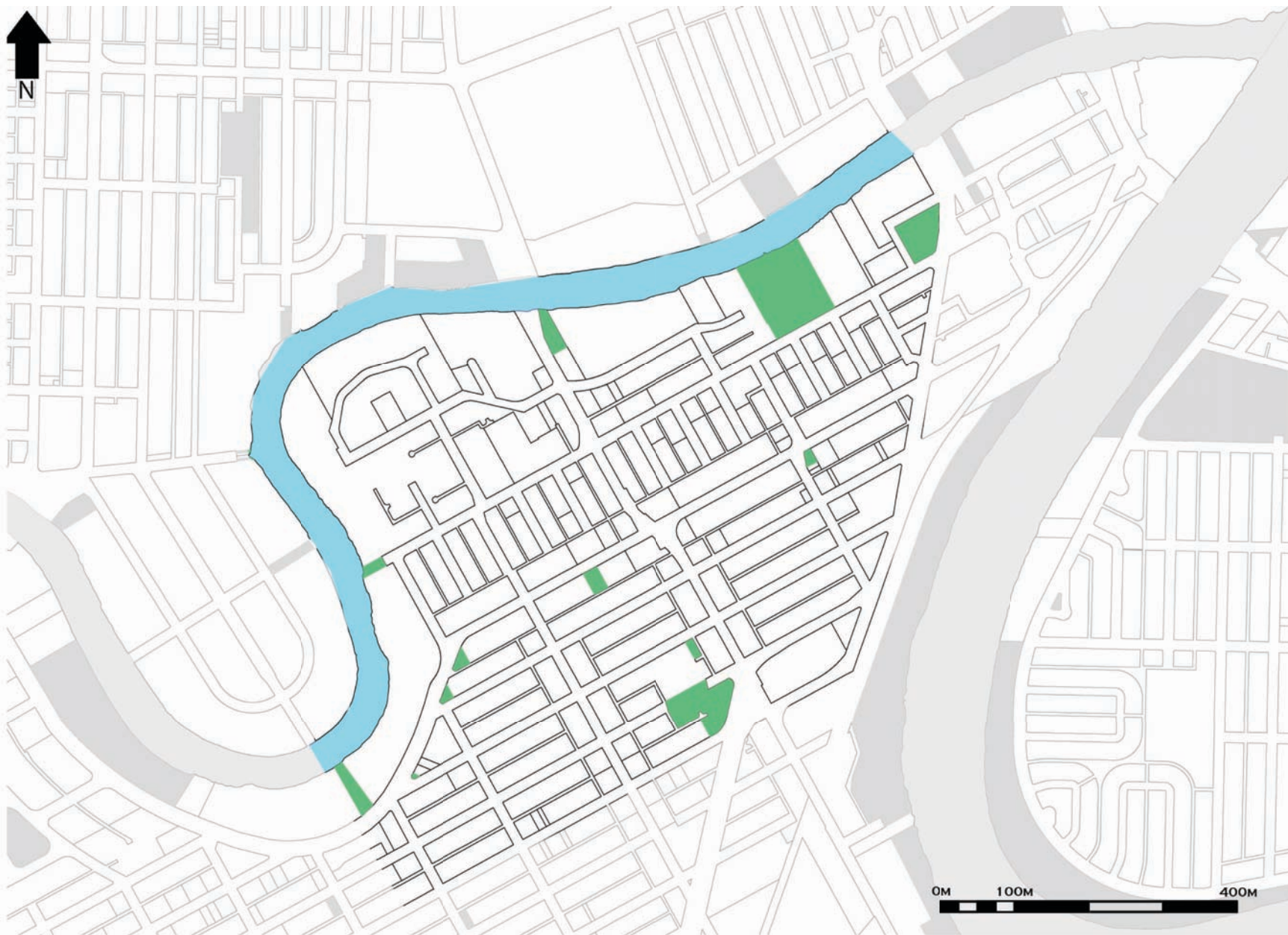

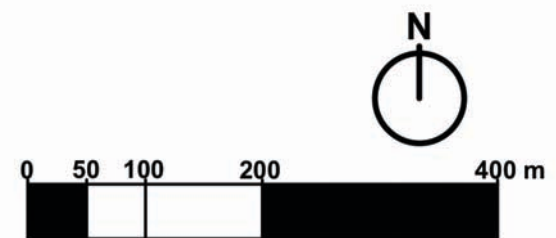

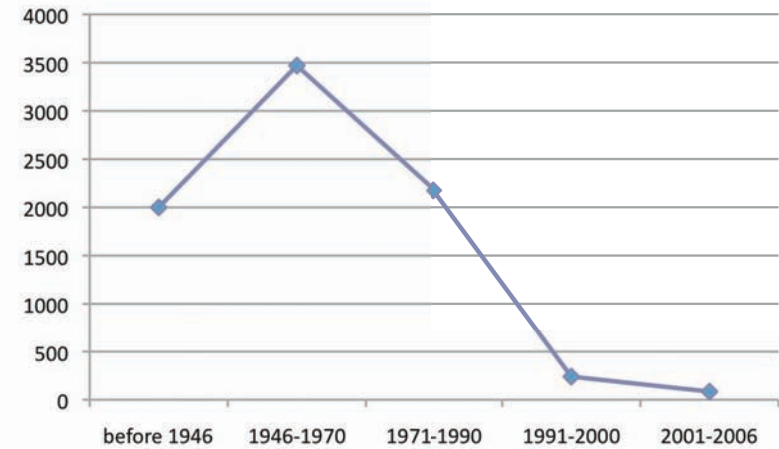

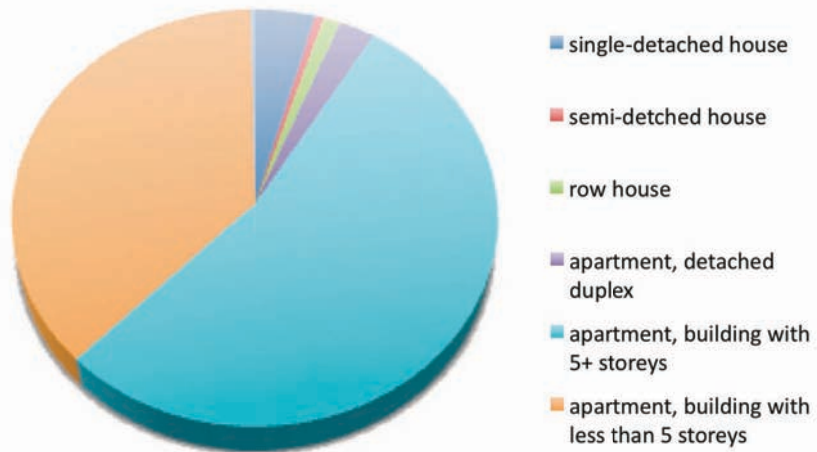


AGE OF CONSTRUCTION

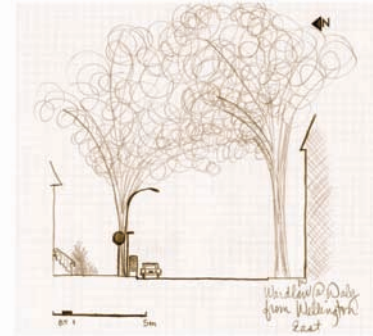

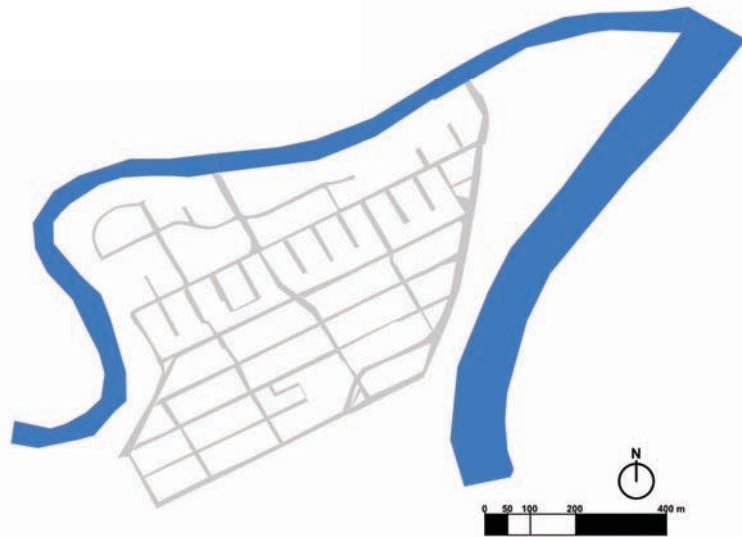

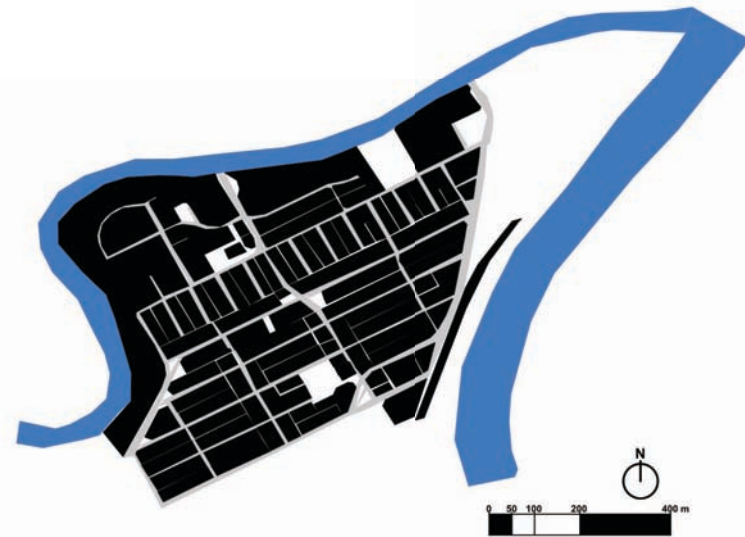

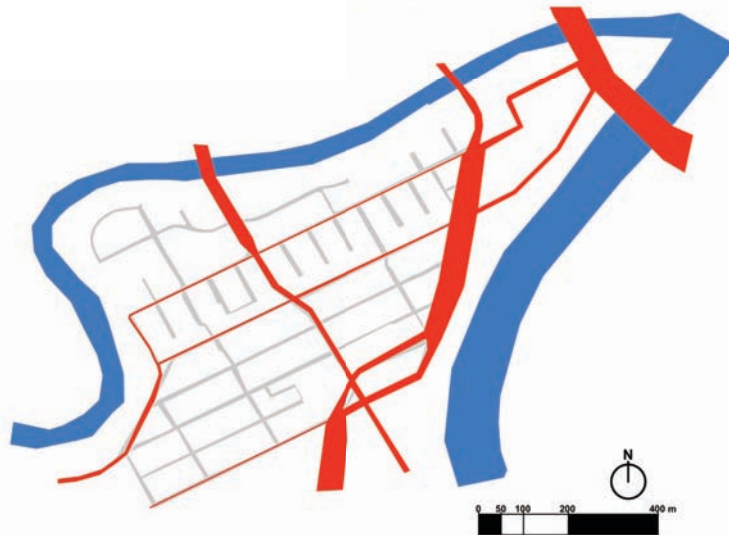

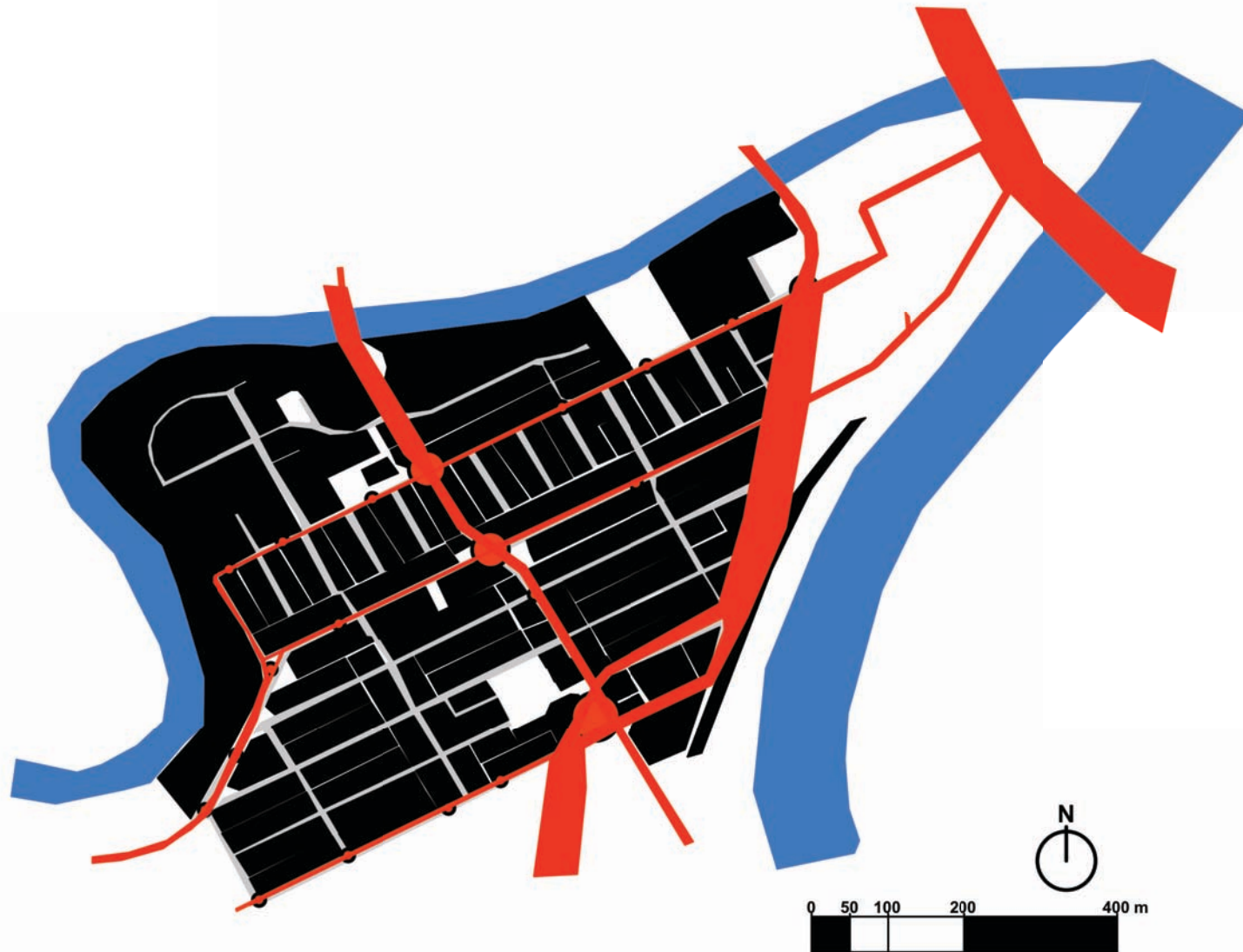
Vehicle Flow



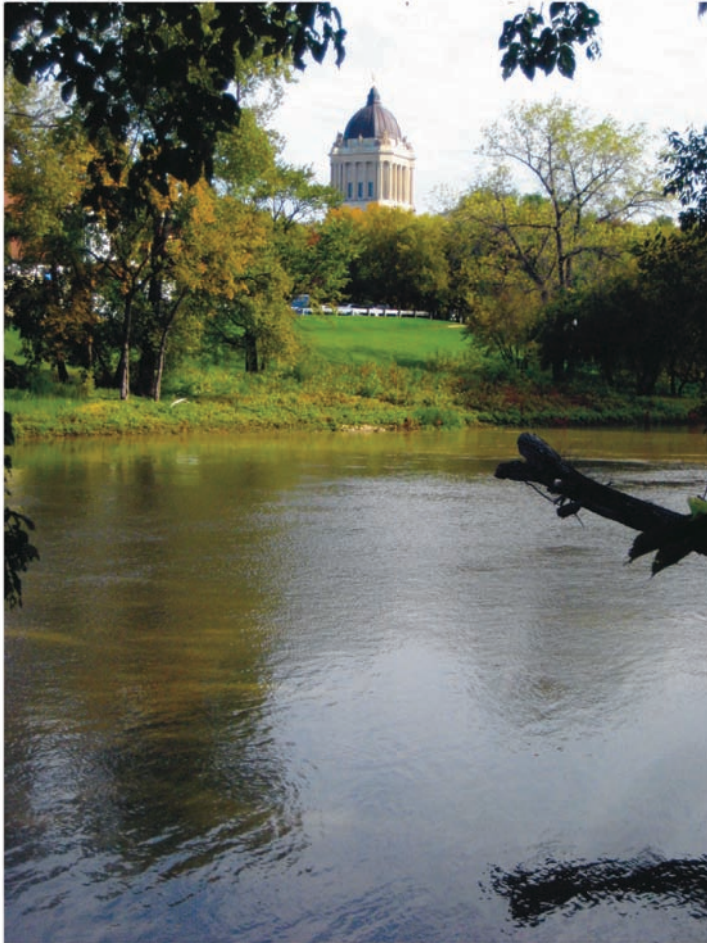

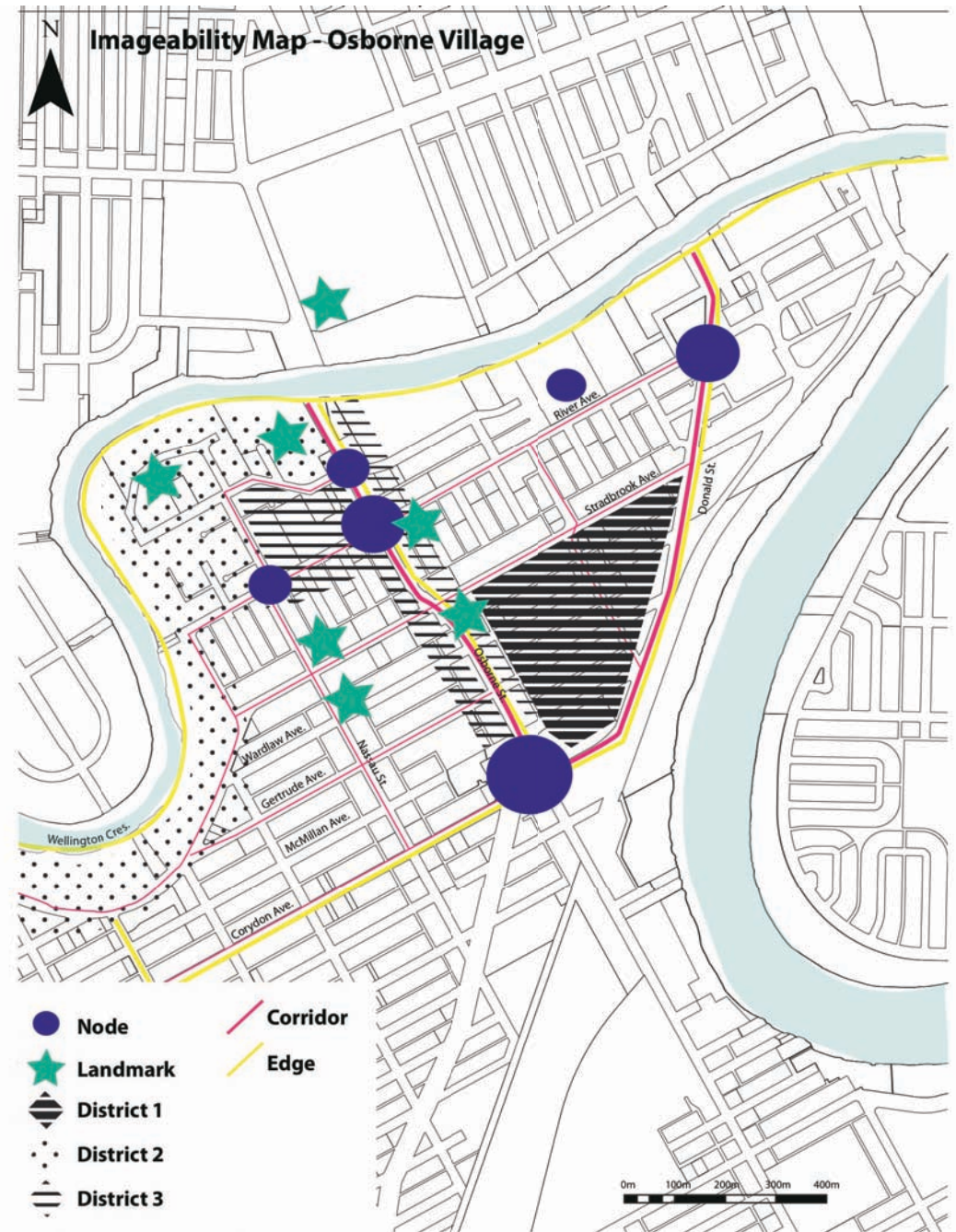
